* The right time for a book.

"And this time when I picked it up it was like a brand new book and I completely understood it and I absolutely loved it, it was an amazing book."

When we hit bumps in the road, we tend to take it personally. But sometimes, it's just not the right time for a particular book. We can choose to set it aside knowing that when the time is ripe, the seeds we have planted will flourish.

* Stolen moments and pockets of time.

"I was taking them to art lessons for two hours and I thought during that speck of time I'm going to start working on this and I'm going to see if I can do it. And that's how The Father Brown Reader 1 actually happened."

It's easy to think that someday we'll have time and space to really get to work on our own creative projects. But Nancy used stolen moments in her week to get her first book written. What pockets of time can you find in your week to move your projects forward step by step?

* Meagan's husband wasn't a reader—until he encountered audiobooks.

"He never really even consider himself a reader until he discovered audiobooks, which is so funny to me. It just shows you how many different ways people can interact with a book."

* First encounters.

"I was hoping that they would have this great first encounter with this great man and have these good feelings about him and then slowly get more into Chesterton."

This is an excellent way to approach homeschooling in general. Our job isn't necessarily to provide exhaustive information on every topic. Instead, we can confidently provide great first encounters. As Charlotte Mason says, we lay the rich and varied feast and each child takes what she needs.
